

# Vision 2021 II

"...If you hold to my teaching, you are really one of my disciples. Then you will know the Truth and the Truth will set you free ... if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." (John 8:31-36).


In this, the second installment of my vision for WCPC, there are ten (10) stands, decisions, disciplines and practices we must adopt. In the interest of brevity, I'll not reprint the first part of the vision. So, you may want to refresh your memory (*The Times*, January 11, 2021) before continuing on with this the second Part.

Which begs the question, how do we move on from here? Above all, the first part must be undergirded with a strong eager witness for people to accept Christ as Savior and Lord. In order for the Church to pursue such a vision, there are ten stands, decisions, disciplines and practices we must adopt.

- 1. That we can only lead people to the Lord by being like Him, not by the Church being like the world and adopting its ways.
- 2. That teaching people to "put away their idols" is an essential prerequisite to leading them in spiritual growth.
- 3. That the practice of regular biblical worship, both corporately and privately, become a foundational issue in the life of our church members.
- 4. We must teach all believers that they are called of God, and help them to discover and live out that calling, as every member comes to understand the "priesthood of all believers."
- 5. We must come to understand the difference between a "Christian survivalist mentality" which is negative and reactionary and a true biblical Remnant Lifestyle which is positive and proactive, and we should become a church who effectively prepares people for remnant living.
- 6. In order to carry out the vision as stated, we would have to make a deliberate decision regarding numerical and spiritual growth.
- 7. WCPC needs a bigger vision of its role for God in the Rio Rancho area, not with a view toward becoming one of the largest churches, but of becoming one of the few safe environments for the disillusioned consumer Christian.
- 8. We must maintain a strong evangelical staff sufficient to the size of our ministry, but continue the path we are on to becoming more and more a lay-oriented church.
- 9. WCPC has a call from God of a "sending" Body. To fulfill the vision, we must constantly identify, prepare and send people out into all sorts of Gospel ministry.
- 10. WCPC is uniquely set apart and called, in the Reformed tradition, to *Preach and Teach Biblical Truth and Live that Truth in Love*.

In our next issue, we'll examine the third and final phase of my vision for 2021.

# I BELIEVE...

in God the Father, Almighty, maker of heaven and earth; And in Jesus Christ His only Son our Lord...

Here begin the opening affirmations in the ancient confession of faith known as the **Apostles' Creed**, the subject of a 4week study at Westside, on Zoom and in person, that wraps up this week.

Is the Apostles' Creed inspired Scripture? No, but it is a concise summary of what is contained there. Was it written by the Apostles? No, but captures in a nutshell the apostolic testimony given to the Church.

Creeds became a useful tool in the early church, for those approaching baptism and church membership, to memorize essential teachings of the Christian faith and recite them as they were lowered into the water. Creeds were also employed to push back against false teaching that was seeping into the church; for example, the popular gnostic ideas that the material world was irredeemably evil, created by a lesser god and that Jesus only appeared to be human and his bodily resurrection was only a spiritual resurrection. Against these teachings, the Apostles' Creed stood unapologetically firm; I BELIEVE.

Once again, our Zoom study proved to be a popular vehicle for the Body of Christ ("the holy catholic church"), locally and out-of-state, to gather together in study and fellowship ("the communion of saints")!
