

Do You Now Believe?

"By this we believe... Jesus answered them, 'Do you?""
John 16:30-31

Jesus says that a time is coming when, "you will leave me." Many a Christian worker left Jesus, His church, and has gone to work out of a sense of duty for his own "good" cause. Why? The absence of the resurrection life of Jesus. You see, when we get out of intimacy with God, we naturally cling to our own religious understanding of Jesus and His mission (Prov. 3:5-6). There's no sin in it. No penalty. But when a person comes to their senses he realizes how he has handicapped his understanding of Jesus, His Mission, and the mission of His Church. Therefore, we have caused confusion, grief, and problems for ourselves, our family and our church.

If we learned anything the last two years, we should believe that we need to <u>rely</u> on the resurrection life of Jesus on a much deeper level than we do now. We should get in the habit of continually seeking His counsel on everything, instead of making our own common sense decisions and then asking Him to bless them. He will not bless them; it's not in His nature to do so; those decisions are severed from reality*.

Are you still doing something simply out of a sense of duty? If so, you are trying to live up to a standard that competes with Jesus Christ. This fuels your pride and arrogance that you know what to do in every situation. You have enthroned your sense of duty, in effect, and dethroned the resurrection life of Jesus. You're not told to "walk in the light" of your own conscience or a sense of duty, but "walk in the light as He is in the light" (1 John 1:7).

Let's be clear, even when Christians do something out of a sense of duty, it's easy to explain our actions to others. But, Christian, when we do something out of obedience to the Lord, there can be no other explanation – just obedience. That's why, faithful Christian, faithful church, you can be so easily ridiculed and misunderstood. It is with shame, remorse, and humility (the opposite of pride) that we must do an about face and return to the Resurrected Life.
