Putting a face on 2023





Against all Hope...

"Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became..." (Romans 4:18-22).

Even when there was no reason for hope, Abraham kept hoping and believing God's promise. At 100 years old, Abraham faced the fact that his body was as good as dead and his wife's womb was as good as dead, too (v.19). But Abraham's faith didn't waver. Rather than growing weaker in the faith, he grew stronger, "He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief" (v.20a KJV). How did Abraham cling to God's promise when all seemed hopeless? Paul goes on to explain, Abraham "was strong in the faith, giving glory to God." This is something the church desperately needs to realize in worship and our personal walk with Him.

I think a better interpretation than, "was strong in the faith" is "was made strong." How? He gave glory to God. Abraham did not stagger in unbelief, because he gave glory to God. To give glory to God does not mean primarily anything Abraham said or did. That follows. But above all, Abraham glorified God by just realizing who and what God is. This is an encouragement for anyone struggling with hope. When is the last time you have pondered the glorious attributes of God? Think on just four attributes of God that will strengthen your faith:

- 1. God is **eternal** and creator of all. "Tell them 'I Am sent you" (Exodus 3:14). Sing with me, "Immortal, invisible, God only wise..."
- 2. God is **omnipresent**. He's everywhere. "If I ascend up into heaven, he is there. If I make my bed in hell, he is there. Where shall I go to flee from his Spirit? From his presence?" (Psalm 139).
- 3. God is **omnipotent**. There is no limit to His power. Is there anything too hard for the Lord (Genesis 18:14)? Nope. Is there anything the Lord cannot do? Nope. "With God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26).
- 4. God is **righteous**. His justice, His truth, His holiness never change. He is absolutely everlasting and consistent (Psalm 100:5).

The secret of faith is to get to know God and apply all that you know in your own life and experience. "He staggered not, but gave glory to God." It is our ignorance of God that creates our main trouble. So don't think too much about how little your faith is. But get to know God, realize the truth about him, and as you do you will glorify Him and your faith, too, will be made strong. May God enable us to do all this by His grace!
